



What are the health requirements?

1	<p>TUBERCULOSIS CLEARANCE:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must be completed within one year before first entrance into school in Hawai'i (preschool or K to 12). • The Tuberculin test (Mantoux) must be performed by a U.S. licensed Medical Doctor (MD), Doctor of Osteopathy (DO), Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN), Physician's Assistant (PA), or The Hawai'i Department of Health. • Infants who first attend school before age 12 months must submit a TB certificate to the school before they reach 14 months of age.
2	<p>PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must be completed within one year before first entrance into school in Hawai'i (preschool or K to 12) • Must be performed by a U.S. licensed MD, DO, APRN, or PA.
3	<p>IMMUNIZATIONS:</p> <p>Immunizations required for school attendance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DTaP/DTP/Td (diphtheria/tetanus/pertussis) • Polio • MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) • Hepatitis B • Hib (<i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b) (for preschool attendance) • Varicella (chicken pox) <p>All immunizations must meet minimum age and interval requirements between vaccine doses.</p>

What does Hawai'i State Law require for School Attendance?

Hawai'i State Law requires all students to meet examination and immunization requirements before they may attend any public or private school in the state. School means any:

- group child care home
- day nursery
- day care center
- child care center
- Head Start program
- preschool
- kindergarten
- elementary school
- middle school
- secondary school

Are Exemptions Allowed?

Children may be exempt from immunization requirements for medical or religious reasons, if the appropriate documentation is presented to the school. Religious exemption forms may be completed at the school that your child will attend. Medical exemptions must be obtained from your child's doctor. No other exemptions are allowed by the State.
